And I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Then I said, "Here am I! Send me."-Isaiah 6:8

With the weather warming up and the days getting longer, we know that Spring is here! I love Spring...it is my favorite season. It signifies the end of the dark and cold months. Flowers bloom and there is renewed hope visible in creation. As you will read later in the newsletter, we are making some positive changes to our worship and fellowship as it relates to the pandemic. There is light at the end of the tunnel, and I feel very optimistic about where we are headed.

With that in mind, I thought I would do a short reflection on faith using this analogy of flowers blooming in the Springtime. John Schumacher will be very happy with me as I get to talk about farmers once again.

If there was ever a ranking or if it was even possible to measure how much faith one has, I think farmers would be somewhere higher up on the list. Think about it, farmers depend on things they have no or very little control over. Soil, rain, sunlight, you name it.

Today's technology helps to try to get some sort of control, but most of it depends on natural elements that farmers have no control over. All they can do is prepare the land and plant the seed. Then wait for the crops to come out. It's actually a beautiful process if you've ever been a part of it.

My parents used to own some land and each year around October and November, which was the beginning of our summer in Zimbabwe, we would get the land ready for planting. We were not commercial farmers, so we didn't have all the big machines and equipment I've seen on the farms here in North Dakota.

We would usually hire a small tractor or sometimes we had oxen like we talked about in worship with the yoke a few weeks ago. Then, we would line up with hoes, and plant the seed by hand. As you can imagine, this was a long process which was very tedious. But the beauty of it all was when we would go to the farm early in the morning and see the little corn shoots bright green in straight rows splattered across the field.

All we did was to plant the seed, waited and watched it grow. Life sprung up from the ground; beautiful life rising from dirt.

The word of God is like a seed planted in the dirt which sprouts forth and brings life to the world. It is like the rain and the snow that water the earth making it bring forth life in plants and animals. Jesus likens the word of God to seed being sown by a sower. Some of it falls on fertile soil and grows well but some falls on rocks and dry paths and dies.

Most of the time we don't see how the seed grows and turns into a plant. It happens in the ground, where the seed germinates, develops roots, and shoots up. Much of this is like our faith. I know some people can tell you where and when exactly they got their faith, but for most people faith is something we can't really explain. If someone was to ask you when you started believing in God, we wouldn't have an exact answer. Because faith is like a plant.

In his letter to the Romans, Paul tells us that faith comes by hearing the word of God. This word we hear when we read the Bible. We hear it at church, in hymns, sermons, and teachings. The word of God is like a seed, but different in that, it's not just a one-time seed we get once in our lifetimes. It's a gift that keeps on giving because, the more we hear God's word, the more the seed takes root. Then it grows, and soon enough it shoots out and we find ourselves realizing that we do in fact believe in God.

The second day of April we are bringing back our Children's Good Friday Service!! The service will include special music, fun activities and the children and their families experiencing the stations of the cross.





Greetings,

Blessings to you and your family during this Lenten Season. Our executive team has recently met to discuss where we are at in relation to COVID and the church. Case numbers and particularly hospital numbers continue at this time to trend in a positive direction. That's very exciting and hopeful. In the last few weeks, it has been really great to see members that haven't been able to attend church in over a year able to come back now that they have been vaccinated. That indeed is reason for optimism and JOY!!

With that, we are tentatively planning to switch from <u>Masks REQUIRED to Masks RECOMMENDED beginning with the</u> <u>church service on April 11<sup>th</sup></u>. This means we will keep the mask requirement in effect through Easter worship. Two reasons why we chose April 11<sup>th</sup> are:

Traditionally Holy Week and Easter Services are very well attended which means more members in a tighter space. It will be very hard to maintain 6' of spacing

With another 3 weeks for vaccination taking place, the percentage of people fully vaccinated by April 11<sup>th</sup> should increase quite a bit for those getting vaccinated

We will continue to require masks for Sunday School, Confirmation and LYO. Our classrooms are very small and that age group won't be eligible for vaccines any time soon. They must continue to wear them at school. If the school were to decide to drop the mask mandate, we would also revisit this requirement. We also plan to resume more traditional communion and coffee fellowship on April 11<sup>th</sup>. Pastor Tawanda and the worship team will work on putting together a process for communion that we feel will be safe for everyone to receive communion. It has been a really long journey to start to return to NORMAL. But regardless of what your view on COVID is, our council along with Pastor Tawanda has always taken the perspective that we need to Love our Neighbor by taking care of each other's safety during this pandemic. We hope you can appreciate that.

One last item we would like to give information on is church offering. Our general offering is what keeps our church operating and whether we have in-person attendance or online, 120 people in attendance or 20 people in attendance, it does not change the fact we need offering to pay our employees and utilities. During the first two months of 2020 our general offering was \$22,707.35 while in 2021 our general offering was \$19,111.16. In our budget approved at our annual meeting in January, we need \$25,697.00 in offering each month to pay our approved budgeted expenses. For January and February our income has been \$3,883.04 short to cover our expenses. This will be unsustainable if we continue on this track. We feel as a council we have been very thoughtful and diligent in how we spend the offering over the last year. We encourage you to set up Give+online giving tool to use it to set up an automatic, continuous giving. Many area churches have found that consistent offering is the key to alleviating worrying about covering expenses. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact members of the Executive team.

We wish you a Happy and Healthy Lenten season and hope you are all able to gather again with family,
