Our 8th graders took their annual trip to Amundson Funeral Home Nov 14.



October 28, 2018-unofficial minutes

IN ATTENDANCE: Pastor Amy, Darwin Potter, Paul Strande, Sarah Krogfoss, Beth Kurz, Deb DeMoe, Tracie Ivesdal, Sara Munson, Roy Olson, Alicia Schumacher ABSENT: James Thorson

CALL TO ORDER

Meeting was called to order by Darwin at 6:28 p.m.

LITURGY:

Pastor Amy led the Church Council in devotion prior to the meeting.

AGENDA APPROVAL

A fifth item was added under "Old Business" – sound system update. **Motion**: Paul moved approve the agenda as amended. Deb seconded. Motion carried.

MINUTES APPROVAL

No modifications were made to the September 23rd Church Council meeting minutes. **Motion**: Paul motioned to approve the September 23rd meeting minutes. Sara seconded. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORTSS

Tracie summarized the financial reports for September. General Giving income was \$12,178.18. Net income was \$1,295.90. As of September 30, the General Giving checking account balance was at \$3,834.87. Special Giving income for September was \$984.00. Special Giving net income was \$642.83. The Special Giving checking account balance as of September 30 was \$38,713.25. Total combined assets are at \$42,548.12.

Tracie is going to start providing the Council with a report that contains additional financial information, such as where we are at with our line of credit and special expenses.

Motion: Deb moved to approve the Financial Reports. Beth seconded. Motion carried.

CALENDAR REVIEW

Paul request that the LYO service Sundays be added to the calendar. They are the third Sunday of every month. No additional changes were made to the calendar.

PASTOR'S REPORT

See attached report provided prior to the meeting. The main secretary book will contain an actual attached copy of the report.

MEN'S CLUB AND WELCA REPORT

Men's Club: Roy mentioned that one of the cement slabs out near the dumpster is uneven. One of the church members tripped recently and got bruised up. Gary is going to look at it. Paul mentioned that there is

a hole in the walking bridge that goes out to the grass parking lot and that we should think about getting that fixed as well. Roy said that he'd look at it.

WELCA: Festival of Tables is coming up on November 4.

TEAM REPORTS

Executive: Darwin Potter – We had an executive team meeting last week. Everything that was discussed will be presented at this meeting.

Education: Alicia Schumacher – they are gearing up for the Advent Event and looking for people who can help out with that. They have a lot of fun activities planned.

Fellowship: Sara Munson – November 11 there will be a "green event", but she's not entirely sure what that will look like yet.

Outreach: Sarah Krogfoss – They are planning to have the "giving tree" again this year. Julie Brorby will be heading that up.

Food Pantry: Sarah Krogfoss – No update on the food pantry. Deb mentioned that the food drive went well. The first Food Pantry Board meeting is coming up November 12.

Properties: Roy Olson – They will install the new oven sometime in November. Darwin asked if Bill fixed the speaker in the kitchen but Roy wasn't sure.

Worship: Deb DeMoe – A couple generous people donated a pre-lit Christmas tree, so that will be used this year. The poinsettia ordering will be coming up. Val volunteered to pick up the poinsettias again this year. Decorating the church for Christmas is scheduled for the end of November. They also discussed purchasing an additional banner for baptisms.

Youth: Paul Strande – They had 39 kids at the last LYO event. The kids also helped organize the food donated for the food pantry. The bingo event got snowed out, so they are going to make it up on November 7th.

OLD BUSINESS

Church Checkup (Fall Meetings)

Our fall church checkup meetings are coming up. Our first meeting is October 30. Darwin handed out copies of materials for the meetings. One of the sheets is for the meeting leaders. Darwin reminded everyone that the meetings are not meant to solve any of the issues – we just don't have enough time. Another one of the sheets contains questions to help guide the meeting. You don't have to cover every question – it's to be used more as a tool in case there is a lull in the conversation. Darwin reminded the recorders to do the best they can to record the meeting. The only thing left to do for this event is to send out the survey to members that can't make it to the meetings or those who haven't attended church for a while.

President and Vice President Terms

The executive team met and looked at 4 potential options for the President and Vice President terms. The executive team whittled it down to 2 options that they have brought to the Council for discussion. Option 1 is to leave things the way they are. Option 2 is the leave the President term as 1 year, which is what the current term is now; however, if you run for president, you would be encouraged to run for a second term. The Vice President term would be 2 years and the VP would not automatically become the President. If there are issues with the President or Vice President there is currently a process for removing them. Paul pointed out that there is a system of checks and balances, such as the Church Council, which would prevent a rogue president from making bad decisions. The biggest downside of this is that it might cause a little more work for the nominating committee. Darwin asked for input from the Council and is

hoping that we can decide what direction we want to go and make a motion. Deb mentioned that this would give the President more time to tackle thing on their agenda. Sara asked if this is something that would be decided upon by the Congregation at the Annual Meeting. Darwin replied that, yes, it would have to be voted upon by the Congregation. Deb asked what other churches do. Pastor Amy replied that it varies.

Darwin asked for an unofficial vote. All but one were in favor of Option 2. One member was unsure at this point. This will be brought before the Congregation at the Annual Meeting.

Visual Monitors Update

The wiring needs to be completed for the monitors. The system will be hooked up to a computer that will located near the old piano (at the back of the church). The computer will be able to control the sound system as well, such as the volume. Darwin asked if we need to keep the piano anymore since it is only used once or twice a year. The piano was donated, so it might be better to store it somewhere. For now, it will be stored in the Rosendahl room.

Darwin also mentioned that we need to think about what kind of computer we should purchase to run the system. He's concerned about a laptop because it is more mobile and he's afraid it will be messed with or moved. Pastor Amy mentioned that a laptop could be kept locked up in the office during the week. Alicia mentioned that regardless of whether it's a laptop or desktop, it needs to be kept locked. Paul suggested that it be kept in some sort of box or storage contained that can be kept locked. It doesn't need to have a lot of power, so it could even be an IPad or Surface. The Council needs to decide where the money will come from for this. Darwin asked if we want to discuss it now, or wait until November until all the current sound/visual system bills have come through and are paid. We decided to wait until the November meeting. If needed, we could also ask for donations.

Bookkeeper Position

Vione has decided that she would prefer not to take on the bookkeeper position. Jamie would like to continue as the bookkeeper position, but asked if there was any way that she could work remotely. She really likes the job, but she'd like to be more flexible so that she could do her work while on the road or at kids' activities. Jamie offered to purchase a laptop and have St. Matthews load Quickbooks software on it. There are some issues with the online version of Quickbooks, so we would have to transfer the traditional version. She would keep the laptop secure outside of the church. She would only take receipts outside of church, not checks. Paul mentioned that in this day and age, if we have someone who is a good employee and devoted to the job, it makes sense to provide them with flexibility. Several other Council members agreed. We could always reimburse her a small amount for use of the laptop assuming she purchases it herself. We need to decide to either let her work remotely and figure out the details, or find a new bookkeeper. **Motion**: Sarah motioned to accept Jamie as a bookkeeper. Paul seconded it. Motion carried.

We need to determine the details of how Jamie's position will work. There is a way that Jamie could log in remotely to the church computer, but that could get complicated if Vione is using the church computer at the same time. It is probably easier to just load the software onto a laptop. We decided that it makes sense to have Jamie purchase the laptop since she also wants to use it for personal use, and then reimburse her for a usage fee. Someone suggested that she be reimbursed \$20/month for use of the laptop.

Motion: Sara moved to have Jamie purchase a laptop and we will reimburse her \$20/month for use of the laptop to perform her job. Paul seconded. There was some additional discussion. Darwin asked if we could generate any issues by doing this. We will have to come up with guidelines for her use of Quickbooks and for

working remotely. Pastor Amy mentioned that there are already guidelines in place. Motion carried.

Sound System

Darwin asked if we should have an external person come in and look at the system to get it figured out. We need to find someone who can come in and provide a quote. Paul suggested that we provide a base number, such as \$500, and tell them if it's going to be more than that then they need to provide a quote. Darwin is going to contact HB Sound and Light and Tricorn (from Fargo). Darwin thought that even if it was \$1000, it's worth it to get the sound system fixed. We'll have to figure out where the funds are going to come from. Sara suggested that maybe it come out of the Building Improvement Fund which has a balance of \$1,399.47. Darwin asked for a motion on this.

Motion: Paul motioned that we talk to a company about getting the sound system fixed at a cost of up to \$1000. Tracie seconded. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

Evaluations

Everyone has copies of Pastor Amy's evaluation. Please provide input to Darwin by next Sunday. Please provide these to him in person or securely in his mailbox. The Executive Team will be conducting evaluations with Pastor Amy on November 27th and the rest of the church staff on December 10.

Portico – Pastor's Benefit Package

Darwin provided a document with prices from Portico for Pastor Amy's benefit package. In the past we have always gone with the Gold+ package. Pastor Amy is fine with staying with the same package, which is actually less expensive this year.

Motion: Paul motioned that we accept the Gold+ package for Pastor Amy's benefit package. Beth seconded. Motion carried.

LYO Credit Card Request

Paul explained that as LYO has grown, when he has to purchase supplies out of his own pocket it can add up. While reimbursements have come through quickly, he asked if it would be possible to get a credit card to simplify things. Pastor Amy mentioned that Vione could also purchase supplies, so that is an option as well. Darwin mentioned that when he was on the Properties Team, they had a credit card and the name on the card changed every couple of years as the Properties Team lead changed. Darwin asked Tracie if it would be a big deal to have another name added to the account.

Tracie didn't think it would tough to have another card issued; however, it could be difficult to track the expenses for LYO versus other charges. Paul suggested that for now, he try coordinating with Vione on purchasing supplies. He suggested that we put this request on hold while he sees how things work with Vione. This request has been tabled for now.

Motion: Paul motioned to adjourn. Sarah seconded. Motion carried. Meeting closed at 7:42 p.m. with the Lord's Prayer.
