Dear St. Matt's Friends.

As I write this message on November 16, I am still thinking about last night in Confirmation. Throughout the fall we have been studying the Gospels and focusing on different aspects of Jesus mission and ministry. We have looked at Jesus as teacher and Healer, and these past couple of weeks have been focused on Jesus as Savior. We did a slow walk with Jesus through Holy Week last week, from Palm Sunday, through the cleansing of the Temple and to the upper room. We concluded that night by taking our place at Jesus' table- sitting on the floor in a circle in the dimly lit sanctuary and served one another communion.



Last night we watched some of the movie "The Son of God" that takes us from that Upper Room, through Jesus' tearful prayers at Gethsemane, through the trials, bearing the cross up the hill to Golgotha, and his agonizing death. This is some pretty heavy stuff for 6th-8th graders, but these kids have entered into this journey with a level of interest and maturity beyond their years. I am so grateful for their guides who have provided essential support to their learning.

It might seem strange that we are covering Holy Week now, right before Thanksgiving, but I still need to cover the rest of the New Testament this year. This is how the timeline falls. However, I am finding this deep immersion in Holy Week in mid-November is shaping my thoughts about the Holiday (Holy-Day) Season. As we get immersed in all of the hustle and bustle of Christmas, do we remember WHY Jesus' birth is worth celebrating?

On the day of his death, Jesus told Pilate WHY. He said, "For this I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice."

Can we hear his voice in our hearts and minds? Are we listening in this hectic season?

We are looking ahead to Christmas. But as we rewind the clock to picture sweet Baby Jesus asleep on the hay, sheltered in some cave near Bethlehem, I cannot help but be reminded of that other cave, somewhere near Jerusalem, where some years later this same human body will rest in death. In both cases, so vulnerable; so very human. That's us, don't you see?



It's all one Divine move. This baby is Emmanuel—"God with us." God choosing to be with us in this flesh--in birth and death and everything in between. This is not just a happy birth but God in Jesus stooping down to make a way to bring us all out of the darkness of our caves, into the light of reconciliation and resurrection. This baby, this cross, this Jesus—this is **the way, the truth and the life** for us all. That is, after all, why he was born.



items to raise money during the Sox for Kids annual fundraising event being held on Saturday, December 9th, at the Hatton Community Center (at 6:00 pm).



Worship Services will be held at **4:30pm** and 7pm this year. Both will have a special time for children and candle lighting.






