CALL TO ORDER: Meeting was called to order by Darwin at 11:25 a.m.

LITURGY: Pastor Amy led the Church Council in devotion prior to the meeting.

AGENDA APPROVAL

No modifications were made to the agenda. **Motion**: Beth moved approve the agenda as amended. Paul seconded. Motion carried.

MINUTES APPROVAL

A modification was made to the wording under "Education Team" reports. It was noted that Alicia was preparing for First Communion, not Confirmation. **Motion**: Paul motioned to approve the December 16th Church Council meeting minutes as modified. Sara seconded. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORTSS

Tracie summarized the financial reports for December. General Giving income for December was \$28,990.66. Net income was \$14,744.08. As of December 31, the General Giving checking account balance was at \$9,119.58. The Special Giving checking account balance was at \$29,548.74. Net income for 2018 was negative \$8,821.32. With the end-of-the-year increase in giving we were able to completely pay off our line of credit. Our income was much less than anticipated; however, expenses were also less than planned, thus our net income for the year wasn't as bad as it could have been. **Motion**: Roy moved to approve the Financial Reports. Sara seconded. Motion carried.

CALENDAR REVIEW

Several additions were made to the agenda. The kids ski trip is March 8-10. The Women's Retreat is scheduled for March 23 and 24. The Fish Fry events are March 15, March 29 and April 12. No additional changes were made to the calendar.

PASTOR'S REPORT

MEN'S CLUB AND WELCA REPORT

Men's Club: Nothing new to report.

WELCA: Donut making will be coming up on February 23rd. Also there is a Welca meeting on February 3rd.

TEAM REPORTS

Executive: Darwin Potter – Nothing new to report.

Education: Alicia Schumacher – They had a movie day today. They are gearing up for First Communion.

Fellowship: Sara Munson – The Birthday Bash was very successful. We had a great turnout. Chelsea Lupien has agreed to be the Fellowship Team Lead. Ruth Waller and Sara will remain on the team. They are planning a Bunco family day in March and a High Tea event for the women in May.

Outreach: Sarah Krogfoss – Darwin reported on behalf of Sarah. The Outreach Team has purchased DVDs for the congregation to check out on Sundays. Topics include things such as marriage, relationships, faith, etc... February 24th will be Frozen Fest which will include kids activities as well as a soup competition. The winner of the soup completion will receive the coveted Golden Ladle trophy.

Food Pantry: Sarah Krogfoss – Darwin gave a report for Sarah. In December 317 pounds of food were supplied to 8 households. They served 22 households over the year during 2018.

Properties: Roy Olson – Nothing new to report.

Worship: Deb DeMoe – Darwin reported on behalf of Deb. She wants to thank everyone who is going off council for everything they have done and to thank those that are staying.

Youth: Paul Strande – They had 1 LYO event since Christmas and one event is coming up this week. It was better this month trying to find kids to read during worship.

OLD BUSINESS

1. Church Check Up Ideas- Darwin asked the team leads about the suggestions based on the feedback that was received during the Church Check Up meetings.

Sara mentioned that through **Fellowship** they are going to try and find ways to encompass the different age groups within the congregation.

Roy mentioned that the **Properties Team** has been discussing church security. So far they have been focused on addressing the parking lot lights. A few of the lights have been fixed already and the parking lot is much brighter now. Roy also reminded everyone that we need to switch out the combination on the key pad. That will be done around the 3rd week of February (once all the new Council positions are in place). Roy also asked how Vione and Pastor Amy feel about having the door unlocked while they are here. Pastor Amy stated that it depends on everyone's comfort level. She leaves the door unlocked; however, some groups or individuals will lock the door while they are here. Pastor Amy mentioned that there used to be an electronic buzzer that would go off when the door was opened, but it doesn't work anymore. Roy asked if we should be more concerned about security. Darwin and Pastor Amy mentioned that the Church should remain unlocked during office hours, otherwise it will be up to the individuals or teams that meet here after hours as to whether or not the building should be locked. The Properties Team also discussed the special funds for emergencies, such as furnace repairs. He mentioned that in the past if a big expense comes up, an announcement is made during worship and the congregation usually steps up to fill the void. Darwin felt that it's better to ask for the money when needed rather than have a special fund set up for emergencies.

Paul mentioned that they don't really have any issues or things that need to be addressed on the Youth Team.

There wasn't a whole lot of input on the **Education** side of things, except notification of upcoming events. Alicia mentioned that they already send notices home and there is an online education calendar. The education team isn't sure what else they can do.

Darwin mentioned that in a few months (or mid-year), the Church Council should revisit the recommendations that we received from the Church Check Up meetings. He was going to mention this to James.

2. Annual Congregational Meeting -Everything was turned in and the Annual Report is complete. Hard copies of the report were made available to the Congregation today. Darwin asked the Council to review the income and expense report to make sure everything looked good and made sense. There was some discussion about the difference in the total budgeted expenses for 2018 between what is listed in the Annual report versus the budget sheets provided to the Council. The Council's budget summary sheets list heat and gas as \$6000 when is should be listed as \$3000. The amount listed in the annual report is correct.

3. Youth Team Credit Card

Paul decided that he would like to pursue the youth team credit card. He has had to purchase a lot of supplies for LYO activities in the past few months for which he has to submit reimbursement requests. In addition, Paul feels bad asking Vione to go get a lot of supplies, especially heavy ones such as large cases of drinks for the kids. Plus he dislikes asking her to run to Sam's club for one or two small items. There was some discussion about how to proceed with this and whether we need to adjust the line of credit on the card. Paul said the most he would need in a month is \$250 to \$300. Tracie thought that it would be easy just to get a card issued in Paul's name without increasing the credit amount.

Motion: Beth motioned to support issuing of a credit card to the Youth Team lead (Paul). Alicia seconded. The line of credit will remain the same on the credit card for now. Tracie mentioned that she will need the minutes from today's meeting to enact this change with the bank. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Locking Doors

There have been issues with the kitchen door being unlocked. Just a reminder to please make sure the door is locked when exiting that door.

2. WiFi Administrator

Darwin would like to have someone assigned as a WiFi administrator. He is willing to help resolve issues if any come up, but he was wondering if we could find someone on one of the teams to help here. It shouldn't be a lot of work, but we should have a person responsible for this.

3. Audit Review

The audit team performed their annual review. They focused on the general giving accounting to make sure the numbers added up because are general giving income was so low. Everything checked out on that account. They also reviewed all of the line of credit expenses, which were also accurate. They discussed needing to update our inventory of equipment and property. This was brought up the last time they did their review. They would like any church property above \$250 to be included. For example, Roy mentioned that we should include the lawn mower and church tables and chairs that are out in the shed. Darwin suggested that every team could help by inventorying the equipment/property for a room to which they are assigned. The estimated replacement value for the equipment/property also needs to be included.

4. Council Meeting Dates

The suggested date for the next meeting is February 17th at 1:00 p.m. The meeting will be a retreat. James will be in touch with everyone on the exact time.

Darwin concluded the meeting by thanking everyone for their help and service this past year.

Motion: Roy motioned to adjourn the meeting. Sara seconded. Motion carried.

Meeting closed at 12:27 p.m. with the Lord's Prayer.
