## Building Relationships in 2021

### Matthew 9 & 10

<sup>35</sup>Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. <sup>36</sup>When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. <sup>37</sup>Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; <sup>38</sup>therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

10:<sup>5</sup>These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: "Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, <sup>6</sup>but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. <sup>7</sup>As you go, proclaim the good news, 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.' <sup>8</sup>Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons. You received without payment; give without payment. [<sup>9</sup>Take no gold, or silver, or copper in your belts, <sup>10</sup>no bag for your journey, or two tunics, or sandals, or a staff; for laborers deserve their food. <sup>11</sup>Whatever town or village you enter, find out who in it is worthy, and stay there until you leave. <sup>12</sup>As you enter the house, greet it. <sup>13</sup>If the house is worthy, let your peace come upon it; but if it is not worthy, let your peace return to you. <sup>14</sup>If anyone will not welcome you or listen to your words, shake off the dust from your feet as you leave that house or town.

Relationships are at the center of God's mission in the world. We were created to be in relationship with God and with each other.

In the reading above, Jesus sends the disciples out on mission. It says that as he went from city to city preaching the good news and curing diseases, he saw the people in those places and was filled with compassion for them. Then he sends out the disciples to go from place to place to help and serve the people there. He invites them to take nothing with them but to go and form relationships with people in those places, who in turn will host and provide for them.

He uses examples from daily life that we all can relate to here in North Dakota. The harvest is already plentiful, he says, but laborers are needed for work in the fields of daily life. That's where you and I come in.

Our world today is a big field in need of laborers to tend to it. There is a lot going on from wars, violence, racial injustices, poverty, and brokenness.

What are we to do?

Our faith invites us to go out into the world and share God's peace with those in turmoil. Our worship sends us out to love and serve those in need. We are invited to let our conversations and actions be shaped by the good news. To speak love and share the joy of salvation. To remind others that God loves them, and nothing can ever change that fact. To extend Christ's peace wherever we find ourselves. Peace that passes all understanding. And to share our bread with the hungry. Those who hunger for food as well as those who hunger for healing, love, validation, and worth.

May 2021 be a year of building relationships and reaching out. Happy New Year!
