Greetings St. Mathews Friends,

I am excited to begin my time with you as your interim pastor. I felt warmly welcomed and enjoyed the energy and enthusiasm of this congregation during Lent 2022, so I expect good things to come. The agreement we have come up with for my time with you is not your typical pastoral call, so you might have some questions about why the arrangement is the way it is and how this is going to work, so let me attempt to address them.

First, you may wonder why am I being hired as an Interim? Why not just accept a position as a called pastor with no end date? This is due to my family situation and our current thoughts about our family's future. Let me tell you a bit about my family. I am married to Brian, who is a 3rd grade teacher at Ben Franklin Elementary in Grand Forks. We have a daughter, Gracia (pronounced Gray-sha), who is in her second year at St. Olaf College and a son, Micah, who is a junior at Red River High School. We are committed to staying in Grand Forks until Micah has graduated, but it is likely that we will be relocating after that. For this reason, I did not want to make myself available for a regular pastoral call but felt able to sign a contract to serve as your pastor until the end of May 2024. The church may well want to restart their call committee before I leave, and I would be very supportive of that effort and will do everything I can to help support the congregation though this process.

You may wonder how much I will be working. When I was here with you last Lent, it was primarily to provide worship leadership. At the time I was also working full time as a hospice for Hospice of the Red River Valley. For this next stretch, I plan to continue my work with hospice, but I am cutting back to only two days a week: Tuesdays and Thursdays. I will not be available for church meetings during those days but will address some church matters in the evenings when needed.

I am now contracted to work for St. Matthew's at a .8 FTE. In addition to planning and leading most worship services, I will be performing visitation, presiding at funerals or weddings, leading pre-marital counseling, baptism orientation, etc. I will be involved in helping to lead confirmation and other educational events. I will be supporting the ongoing work of the council and teams in their efforts to encourage engagement from the congregation. I may well lead book or Bible studies.

Pastor's message continued...

It is key that we are on the same page about the limits of my role. I am not here to "take over" the work of planning or doing the ministry for the church. The primary responsibility of calling meetings and planning and leading fellowship, outreach and youth events lays with the teams, not the pastor. I will come when I can and take part, but please do not feel like you cannot move forward without my leadership. For the long-term health of St. Matthew's, it is the calling of all the people of the church to BE THE CHURCH. Be engaged, creative, forward-looking and involved! This community will be as lively and engaged as the people who are a part of it.

My plan is to generally be at the church on Mondays from 9:00-5:00 and on Wednesdays 12-8:30, unless there is a meeting or a visit I need to be at. If you would like to visit with me, it's fine to stop by during those hours, but you may want to call ahead or email me to make an appointment to make sure I am available. I will also be doing sermon writing and some planning and phone meetings off-site. Because I am not full time, I will be gone about once a month or so. On some of those Sundays, I plan to worship at the United Lutheran Church where we are members. It is good for pastors to be preached to!

Please reach out to me for any needs, questions or concerns. One of the best ways to reach me on the days I am not at the church is through my church email. It is stmattspastor@midconetwork.com. I will be checking it several times a day and will get back to you as soon as possible.

This is all an experiment and a work in progress, but then, ministry always is! I expect we will need to tweak things as we go. But if we are all flexible and are very intentional about communicating, I think we could have a fruitful and fun chapter of ministry together. That's the plan, folks. Looking forward to it!




Donut making has been scheduled for Saturday, February 25, 2023!
