Dear St. Matt's Friends,

I wanted to share with you a little bit about our Lenten Theme, "Who Me? Unlikely Servants of God."

I will be honest, I have not had a whole lot of time to pre-plan Lent since starting with you Feb 16. None of the pre-packaged options I looked at grabbed my attention. So I was inspired to create a series for us, which I am still needing to flesh out. So far I have picked a theme and stories to focus on, and I want to share the **WHY**.

For starters, the confirmation kids are studying the Old Testament this year so that's where I went looking for stories that would reinforce and expand on what they have been learning since they **will be** in church. Also, since we so often focus on the gospel readings on Sundays (you know, because we are a little bit Jesus-centric), I thought it might be nice for all of us to revisit some of these stories we don't get to hear as often.

I picked the theme <u>"Who me? Unlikely Servants of God"</u> because I think that some of you might be thinking or feeling that way at St. Matt's these days.

It is my conviction that St. Matt's is in a critical season--hopefully one of learning and growing. First, like every other congregation on the planet, we are trying to regain footing after Covid-19. Things look different now. Some people left and may not be back. Some are new. Given the circumstances, St. Matt's is a remarkably resilient and active congregation carrying on with ministry. However, there are still some challenges and uncertainties in rebuilding. After listening to you and engaging with the ministry teams and groups, I hear a lot of discussion about how things that used to happen aren't happening in the same way anymore or at all.

That's not *all* bad. When you are going through change, it is a good time to ask what purpose traditions and activities were designed to serve and consider whether they are still working. Which are definite keepers and which ones should stay gone? What patterns or plans need to be adapted or developed for this moment and the people here now? How will it happen? Who will lead the effort? I hear a lot of those kinds of conversations happening at St. Matt's right now.

In addition to all that, you have brought me into the mix! And I am glad to be here to lend thought, prayer and guidance to the cause. But since I am not contracted to work with you full-time, I will be gone some Sundays and I am not at the church as often during the week as some of your former pastors. This means that some things that have been done by pastors in the past will need to be organized or led by members of the church, or they aren't going to happen. Some worship leadership, sharing of messages, Bible studies, fellowship, outreach, education and service opportunities are all waiting to be developed, explored and enjoyed BY YOU ALL! Yay!!!

And to that, you might respond, "Who me? I don't think so."

Well, I get it. In fact, that's how God's people have often responded to God's callings. The most unlikely people in the world have been called to serve God in the most extraordinary ways....sometimes in very public roles, and sometimes behind the scenes. They came in all forms—men, women, old, young, rich, poor. But if you spend much time reading the Bible you will find that almost all the folk that find themselves called by God to some thing—really any *thing*—are generally surprised, skeptical and scared. They almost never felt ready. And then, slowly, they started to believe and even get excited, and found themselves empowered to faithfully act in truly amazing ways....all with God's help. These stories are fun, because God is always surprising people. Even now.

We do not know what shape the ministry of following Jesus will take in the future...at St. Matt's or anywhere. But God knows, and God is already making the way for it. God is busy at this moment calling and equipping a whole new crop of unlikely servants to new adventures here at St. Matt's...including you! Yes, really. You.


