Can we talk about racism for a few minutes? As a 30-year-old black man, who is also an immigrant, and living in Midwest America, I HAVE to talk about racism. I do not have the luxury of ignoring issues of race because I tend to stick out wherever I am in our community. I will be married this September and hopefully, someday, we will have kids of our own. They will be black kids in a very white community...so I REALLY need to talk about racism...for the sake of my future children – if not for my own sake.

We just celebrated Easter – a day filled with optimism and joy. Our Savior is risen from the dead and by this glorious act of sacrifice, we are all freed from sin and death. Jesus saves us and gives us new life! It is a season of hope.

However, some of the other things happening around us, are not as full of hope as Easter. The realities of life in America are not always as cheerful as this season wants to paint them to be. We live with the realities of racial and political injustices. We live in a country where a group of minorities feel the need to protest under the banner of Black Lives Matter.... because they feel that there is a group of Americans who believe that not All Lives Matter.

I know that my last statement here is a trigger for a lot of people. Depending on your political affiliations, you are either dismissing me right now or you are becoming very defensive. But hear me out please: this is not a political statement. This is simply the truth about the lives of certain people, including me – your pastor. Black people are dying, at a scary rate, mostly because of their skin color and the stereotypes associated with being black in America. For some reason, black people, especially men, have been painted as aggressive and violent. But you all know me – am I like that? Then why should I be perceived like that?

I'm sure most of you have never thought about how you would be perceived depending on the clothes you wear. But I constantly think about that. I don't wear hoodies when going shopping, even to the gas station across the street from our church. I wear very bright clothes when biking or walking on trails. I drive a bright blue car by design – to make me look less intimidating and avoid police stops.

A couple of years ago – see how sad this is? – when a black man was shot dead while trying to reach for his driver's license in his pockets, I posted a sarcastic comment online about how I would start driving with my license taped to my windshield just in case I got pulled-over and wouldn't have to reach for my pockets.

When my dad saw that post, he privately told me to be careful with my words and to be safe and respectful. I thought about this for days. And then I remembered a discussion I had been part of with the men's group of my previous church in Iowa.

We went for a retreat and there, we talked about being men of integrity, about setting boundaries but also building bridges. I remembered the covenant we made. We promised to ask ourselves these four questions each time before we speak:

Are my words honest? Are they true? Are they kind? And are they helpful?

I've asked myself these same four questions over and over, the last few days. How do I respond to issues of racism in a way that is honest, true, kind, and helpful? The same question can be put out to you as well as you think about these issues.

It is easy for us to throw out words and make comments on these issues without understanding their effect and power. Our words can be honest and true, but if they are hurtful and unhelpful, they should be kept just to ourselves. I believe our country needs this more so today when truth is subjective, and everyone lays claim to what is true. But we can all agree on what is kind and what is helpful. That is the place we need to gather and meet each other if we are going to create safe spaces for all people, regardless of their skin color. From there, we can discuss what is true and what our faith instructs us.

I welcome conversations regarding this topic. Let's talk about how we can make our community welcoming for ALL people. Let's ignore the national news for a minute, and start with our small church, town, and community.


