Dear St. Matt's Friends.

With Mother's Day coming up, I am thinking about my role as a mother and how it has changed over the years. My son is a junior in high school and my daughter is a sophomore in college, so my mothering is not as "hands-on" as it once was. But I am still asking myself, "What am I modeling to my kids? What values am I handing on to them?" This gets me thinking about lessons I have learned from my mom along the way. Here are a few I'd like to share.

Five Life Lessons I Learned From My Mom

1. Pray for your kids, with your kids, and in front of your kids

All my life I know I have been prayed for every day. At my bedside as a child, in the car before family trips, on my wedding day. When I was growing up my parents ended their devotions every night by praying for the needs of the community, the world and their kids. I know they did, because I heard them, and they also told me that they were praying for me. When I was pregnant with my daughter, my mom gave me a book of prayers for the mother-to-be, reminding me to pray over this little one growing inside, part of her pattern of tutoring me in a life of prayer. I am reminded to tell my kids how I pray for them daily, and to let them hear my prayers.

2. Be Real

There are some things my mom felt strongly about; like if people called her "Mrs. Stanley Larsen" she says, "My name is Ruth, thank you." She has always been free with her opinions, sometimes I have thought *too* free. But you know where you stand with her. She doesn't smile to your face and then talk behind your back. She is loyal to her family, her church, and community but she doesn't pretend everything is ok if it's not. Frustrations come out but so do hugs and forgiveness. What you see is what you get, and while it may not always be pretty, there is a freedom in her "real-ness" that allows other people to relax, feel accepted and be honest about who they are too.

3. Never Fail to Show Hospitality

My mom's home was never perfectly tidy. For many years there was a sign that hung in the kitchen that said, "God Bless this Mess" and she meant it. But the coffee pot was *always* on for whoever might stop by, or whoever happened to be walking by that mom could flag down and persuade to come in. When we lived in a parsonage in rural Fergus Falls, we would have to have our water hauled out from town regularly. Every time, my mom would invite in the delivery man to sit down for coffee and "a little something." She taught me to look beyond the service rendered to SEE the person and their life. But her hospitality goes beyond her cooking and her home. She embodies it. It is an attitude of welcome that travels with her. She offers herself, her attention, and trusts that it is enough.

4. Look out for the overlooked

Time after time I have seen my parents actively reach out to those who were left out, forgotten, or down and out. They did this with their pocketbooks, sponsoring children, giving generously to aid organizations. But they also did it in person, and with their family. From the time when I was about three, I remember going as a family to the nursing home in Beach every month to sing for the residents and visit with them. I also remember kids in the congregation whose families were having trouble coming to stay with us for a while. When my siblings went off to college, it was typical that they would bring foreign exchange students home with them from college. The lesson was repeated often: God has blessed us to be a blessing. 5. Bloom Where You are Planted

This is my mom's favorite expression. It might have something to do with the fact that as a pastor's family, we did our share of moving. I take it to mean, "don't waste your time wishing you were somewhere else, or that you were someone else. Look around. See the richness of the soil you find yourself in right now. Develop and use your unique gifts wherever you are now."

My mom has taught me a lot, and I pray that I can live out these life-lessons in my own home and family, even when they are no longer at home. But you know, come to think of it, each of these are pretty important lessons for our church's household of faith as well, don't you agree? And you? Do you have some other "lessons from mom" (or dad) you would add to the list that would be helpful for our life together?






