#### **UNOFFICIAL MEETING MINUTES – August 28, 2018**

IN ATTENDANCE: Pastor Amy, Darwin Potter, Beth Kurz, Deb DeMoe, Tracie Ivesdal, Sara Munson

ABSENT: James Thorson, Paul Strande, Sarah Krogfoss, Roy Olson, Alicia Schumacher

#### **CALL TO ORDER**

Meeting was called to order by Darwin at 6:30 p.m.

#### LITURGY:

Pastor Amy led the Church Council in devotion prior to our meeting.

#### **AGENDA APPROVAL**

No modifications were made to the agenda.

**Motion**: Deb moved approve the agenda. Beth seconded. Motion carried.

#### **MINUTES APPROVAL**

No modifications were made to the July 31 Council meeting minutes.

Motion: Tracie motioned to approve the July 31 meeting minutes. Deb seconded. Motion carried.

#### **FINANCIAL REPORTS**

Tracie summarized the financial reports for July. General Giving income was \$8,825.00. Net income was negative \$5,568.22. As of July 31, the General Giving checking account balance was at negative \$311.34. Special Giving net income for July was negative \$4,403.47. The Special Giving checking account balance as of July 31 was \$39,116.05. Total combined assets are at \$38,804.71. We are staying on budget expense-wise, we are just down in giving. There was discussion about the Food Pantry account and how we really don't need additional donations at this point. There was also discussion about the Miscellaneous Account and how there is money in the fund that was is put in there for various purposes, such as the ski trip, but it is difficult to keep track of what money is supposed to be designated for what purpose. We need to do a better job of setting up funds that are specific for the purpose, rather than putting money into the Miscellaneous Fund. Pastor Amy asked if we can transfer the money from the Uphold Account, since we were asked to no longer donate to that charity, and put the money into the Mission Fund. Darwin asked if one of the Council members could make a motion to do so.

Motion: Deb motioned to transfer the money from the Uphold Fund to the Mission Fund. Sara seconded. Motion carried.

Motion: Beth moved to approve the Financial Reports. Sara seconded. Motion carried.

#### **CALENDAR REVIEW**

Pastor Amy is going to add the Church Check Up event to the calendar. It will run from November 5 through November 18. No additional changes were made to the calendar.

#### **PASTOR'S REPORT**

See attached report provided prior to the meeting. The main secretary book will contain an actual attached copy of the report.

#### MEN'S CLUB AND WELCA REPORT

WELCA: They have a WELCA meeting coming up on September 16th.

Men's Club: No update.

#### **TEAM REPORTS**

<u>Executive:</u> Darwin Potter – There was an executive team meeting just before this Church Council meeting, but everything we discussed is listed on the agenda for discussion during this Council meeting.

**Education:** Alicia Schumacher – Pastor Amy reported that we have all the teachers lined up and 8 substitutes.

<u>Fellowship:</u> Sara Munson – Everything coming up for the remainder of the year is on the calendar. Fellowship will be helping to provide food for the new member potluck just to make sure we have enough. Also, Fall Frenzival is coming up. We need to talk to Sarah Krogfoss about where the money raised at the Fall Frenzival should go. Pastor Amy suggested that it go to the General Fund.

Outreach: Sarah Krogfoss – Absent. Nothing reported.

**Properties:** Roy Olson – Absent. Darwin reported that Roy and the properties team painted the classrooms.

<u>Worship:</u> Deb DeMoe – Everything related to Worship is on the calendar. We have a lot of activities coming up this fall. She is looking forward to people stepping up and helping with Worship duties.

**Youth:** Paul Strande – Absent. Nothing reported.

**<u>Food Pantry:</u>** Sarah Krogfoss – Absent. Nothing reported.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

#### 1. Church Check-Up (Fall Meetings)

Darwin handed out a sheet that he and Pastor Amy drafted that provides details on the plan for the upcoming church check-up meetings. They really want to have someone at each meeting to record what is said. We want people to feel comfortable and to provide feedback, so we are trying to target multiple venues and groups. Tracie mentioned that if someone has an issue, we should ask them if they have thought about a solution. The date range we are targeting is November 5 through November 18. Darwin asked if we had any thoughts about it or things that we think should be changed. Sara asked how it will work – for example, if we have someone from each group (i.e. – Men in Mission or WELCA) run the meetings, or if someone from outside of the group will come in and moderate the meetings. If there are people from the various teams that are willing to moderate the meeting, then that would be great, otherwise we can find volunteers to assist. We might want to split up into smaller groups for the session after church on Sunday. There will also be an online survey that needs to be completed by November 18. Darwin wants to know how involved the Council wants to be in setting dates. Several Council members expressed interest in being involved in scheduling the meeting dates so that they can make sure they are available to help run the meetings. Sara asked what precipitated these meetings. Darwin explained that he felt like there was a disconnect between the Congregation and the Council. It is often difficult to get feedback to see what people like or don't like about St. Matthews, so we are hoping to get that feedback through these meetings.

#### 2. President and Vice President Terms

Scott Landa has agreed to go through the church constitution with us to look at what would need to be amended if we want to change the President and Vice President terms. Ultimately, the Council needs to decide the terms of each appointment. The idea is that the Vice President would be a separate two-year term and not necessarily assume the role of President. The President and Vice President terms would stagger so that we don't ever have a new Vice President and President starting at the same time. Sara mentioned that it could be intimidating for a brand new president to come in without having prior training. A solution would be for the acting President to spend some time with the new President to help train them in. The idea of a 2-year President is appealing in that we might be able to get more done. Darwin mentioned some other options that Scott Landa brought up in the event that the Present position isn't really working out, such as having to nominate the President into the second year of their term. Darwin is going to have Scott look into it further. All present were in favor of proceeding.

#### 3. Visual Monitors

James put Darwin in contact with a person from ACME, Mark Decker, who is very experienced in dealing with AV systems. Mark has agreed to advise us on how to install the system and he provided us with a recommended list of equipment. Currently, Darwin, James and Josh Faul are working on the system improvements. Mark cautioned Darwin on what TV types and sizes to avoid. The TVs will not be cheap, but if we want people to be able to see them, we need to make the investment. We will also need a computer to help run the system. It will be a desktop-type system that will be located near the piano. This is Phase 2 of the project and we don't currently have all the funds to pay for the whole project, which will probably cost between \$7,000 and \$7,500 when all is said and done. That means we will need another ~ \$1,500. Darwin asked if we want to approve the bid, keeping in mind that we probably won't have to pay this out for another couple of months yet. Motion: Sara moved to approve the bid that Mark Decker provided for the AV equipment. Deb seconded. Motion carried.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

#### 1. Vione and Bookkeeper Position

Jamie will no longer be handling the bookkeeper duties. Vione has agreed to give the position a try, with the understanding that if she doesn't feel comfortable with the duties, we will find a replacement.


