Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On Sept 15, Pastor Jessica Daum, the Director of Evangelical Mission for the Synod office came and spent the morning with us in DIGG (Adult Ed), preached at worship, and joined us at our council meeting. There it was decided that we would become part of a newly forming "Vital Signs" program.

Vital Signs recognizes that our congregation is called to grow in life-giving relationships with God, each other, and the world, and that every vital congregation can become even more vital! This two-year process will help us get in touch with God, discover our congregation's unique call, and engage in holy experiments to be a sign of God's abundant love for our community.

We already have a couple of people who are excited to be on this team and walking with you through the process. We are looking for a few others. You can read more later in this newsletter about what it means to be on the team, and how you could also be a part of it!

We have also been busy welcoming new families into our church, new children into Sunday School and confirmation, and new groups gathering as well. The Lysa Terkeurst book study on Sunday nights has 30 people involved! So awesome!

We also will be holding a "What Does this Mean?" class where we, as adults can come together and remind ourselves what it means to be Lutheran. This class is for those who have never read the Small Catechism, and for those who know it well already. The purpose of this class is to create space for conversations with Luther's Small Catechism, and for all of us to be reminded of what it means to be Lutheran in today's world. The class will most likely be offered on Tuesday evenings, but time and date depend on the availability of those who sign up. If you are interested in attending this class, we ask that you call the church office at 599-2081 so that ensure we have enough materials for everyone.

There are also lots of fun things happening on Sundays this October. From the Fall Frenzival on Oct 6 to the Blessing of the Quilts and Pets on Oct 13, there truly is something for everyone. From the Church Mouse








A trip to experience the Holy Land will change you in many ways.

At the printing of this newsletter, we have borrowed \$7,000 on our line of credit to pay bills for the general fund (things like electricity, water, staff salaries, team budgets, etc). If you have questions, feel free to contact the church office or Tracie Ivesdal, our church treasurer.

What is Vital Signs?

September 15 our congregation began moving forward as a part of the new Vital Signs program. So what does that mean for you as a congregation participant? It means, as a congregation we have promised to:

- 1. Pray regularly, study Scripture, listen expectantly for God's voice and dream for the congregation.
- 2. Grow in discipleship and personal financial stewardship practice (growth giving or tithing and beyond.)
- 3. Promote healthy, Christ-centered relationships and decision making, refraining from gossip and negativity.
- 4. Be full partners in the task of evangelism: sharing faith and inviting people into ministry, partnering in the tasks of visitation and follow-up.
- 5. Cultivate a climate of intentional hospitality for people new to life in the church.
- 6. Relieve the pastoral leader of some routine tasks, i.e. clerical, administration, some pastoral care, excessive meetings, etc. to free them for the work of developing leadership, equipping laity, and evangelism.
- 7. Pray for and financially support evangelism/outreach activities in the community.
- 8. Provide pastoral salary, housing and benefits commensurate with job and synod guidelines.
- 9. Change existing ministries and practices in order to live out God's dream more fully with leadership provided by the pastoral leader and leadership team.
- 10. Support the outreach of the wider church with mission support. At a minimum, commit to grow Mission Support by 1% of your congregation's annual budget each of the two years of the Vital Signs process. Strive ultimately to support at the level of 10% of your regular giving.
- 11. Attend worship regularly and actively participate in fellowship events.
- 12. Invest the cost of this program, \$500 a year for two years = \$1,000 total payable to the Eastern North Dakota Synod. This fee will cover your monthly coaching for 24 months (a \$1,200 value) and the cost of two program 24 hour retreats for 4-7 people (your Transformation Team.)
