



UNOFFICIAL MEETING MINUTES - July 31, 2018

CALL TO ORDER

Meeting was called to order by Darwin at approximately 6:32 p.m.

LITURGY:

Pastor Amy led the Church Council in prayer prior to our meeting. She reminded us that we need both highs and lows in life to truly appreciate God.

AGENDA APPROVAL

No modifications were made to the agenda.

Motion: Roy moved approve the agenda. Sarah seconded. Motion carried.

MINUTES APPROVAL

No modifications were made to the June 19 meeting minutes.

Motion: Alicia motioned to approve the June 19 meeting minutes. Deb seconded. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORTS

Darwin summarized the financial reports for June. General Giving income was \$6,775.30. Net income was negative \$3,633.75. As of June 30, the General Giving checking account balance was at \$1,084.12. Special Giving net income for June was negative \$632.75. The Special Giving checking account balance as of June 30 was \$43,519.52. Total combined assets are at \$44,603.64. We had to dip into our line of credit this past month in order to pay all of our expenses.

Motion: Sarah moved to approve the Financial Reports. Beth seconded. Motion carried.

CALENDAR REVIEW

Note that the all team meeting is Wednesday, August 22 at 6:30 p.m. Pastor Amy will add Sunday school to the calendar for September 9. No additional changes were made to the calendar.

PASTOR'S REPORT

MEN'S CLUB AND WELCA REPORT

WELCA: The festival of tables will be November 4 at 3:30 pm.

Men's Club: Nothing new to report.

TEAM REPORTS

Executive: Darwin Potter – Nothing new to report.

<u>Education</u>: Alicia Schumacher – Vacation Bible School starts on Sunday. We are still down from last year on the number of registrants. Alicia is still looking for 2 more teachers for Sunday school. They are going to change things up this year and have an "Advent Event" rather than a Christmas program with the kids.

Fellowship: Sara Munson (absent) - The tie dye event is Wednesday, August 1.

<u>Outreach:</u> Sarah Krogfoss – They will be serving root beer floats at the tie dye event this Wednesday. They had the Pop On Over event on July 24. They didn't have a lot of people help out, so it was a lot of work for those who did help. They will be serving lunch and giving small gifts for the teachers coming up. The Fall Frenzival event is coming up in October.

Properties: Roy Olson – Not much to report. They continue to mow the lawn.

Worship: Deb DeMoe – Attendance has been down, which is typical for the summer. They are back to organizing the list of upcoming worship assistants. There is a potluck coming up this Sunday, August 5th, for the VBS event.

Youth: Paul Strande - Absent. Nothing to report.

<u>Food Pantry:</u> Sarah Krogfoss – Sarah provided an update on how much food and how many families were served by the food pantry this past spring:

March: 532 pounds of food, 12 families April: 365 pounds of food, 5 families May: 327 pounds of food, 7 families June: 445 pounds of food, 7 families

The food pantry was surveyed by Great Plains Food Bank and the USDA. Both of the inspections were fine.

OLD BUSINESS

Church Health Meeting

We have a list of questions for the Church Health meeting. Darwin asked that we go through them and review the questions before our next Council meeting.

Door Key Codes

Scheduled to be changed August 1. Darwin opened a discussion about who should have access to the code. We had previously discussed only church employees, team leads and external organizational leaders having the code. The Food Pantry helpers also need to be included. There was a general discussion about how those with access to the church key need to get better with putting the key back right away (i.e. – as soon as the door is open). There was also discussion about how the outside group leaders also need to fill out the Building Use form.

President and Vice President Terms

Darwin asked if anyone had given more thought about changing the president and vice president terms. Deb asked if anyone had looked at the bylaws to see what this entails. We can do it, but it needs to be approved by the Congregation. It will definitely require a bit of work to enact these changes; however, it might help encourage more folks to sign up for the vice president position if they didn't have to become president. Plus, it would help with the continuity between the president and the Pastor by having additional time to become familiar with how things work. The only downside to this change may be that people could be discouraged from applying because of the 2 year commitment. Also, if the president wasn't very effective, it wouldn't be good to have them in there for 2 years. The question was raised about whether or not there is a protocol for "impeaching" a president if they were really ineffective. Darwin suggested that the VP and president terms should alternate so that they don't both leave at the same time. We would have to decide if we want move forward with this change first as a Council before bringing the proposed change to the Congregation. If we want to proceed, it would be voted on at a special meeting and then ratified at the Annual Meeting. It could also be brought up to the Congregation during the fall Church Health meeting. Roy thought that it could be detrimental if the VP doesn't have a year to observe the President. Darwin suggested that the outgoing president could help the incoming president, and perhaps the incoming president could observe the president for a period of time. James mentioned that the VP could also help out the incoming president as well. The bylaws would also have to be modified as necessary if this were approved. Most of the council was in agreement and it was decided to proceed.

NEW BUSINESS

Visual Monitors

We received the final invoice for Phase 1, which is complete. We are now in the initial stages of Phase 2. Pastor Amy provided some information about media sources. The preferred option right now is hard wiring since Bluetooth can have connectivity issues. James mentioned that now we need to weigh costs for a large monitor versus a size that is large enough for everyone to see it. James is going to talk to Sharon and Bill about options as well. We still have about \$5000 in the fund to support this effort. The wiring costs shouldn't be too much. The majority of the costs will be the screens and the equipment to project to the screens. The current plan is to have 2 monitors. James will find out more information. Darwin asked if we can assign a deadline to this. Once we decide what we want to do, it shouldn't take long. Pastor Amy suggested early September. Darwin thought early October was more realistic.

Motion: Deb motioned to adjourn. Beth seconded. Motion carried.
